We rejoice in being permitted to lay before you at this interesting season, the ries, progress, plan and dexigns of an institution which claims the highest consideration of every enlightened citizen; an institution, which presents an aspect worthy of the sup-port of every friend of Science, Literature and Religion. every

In presenting to your view, the pronunent features of the Lane Seminary we observe, that it originated with Messrs. E. g.
W. A. Lane, Merchants of New Orleans.
These gentlemen, actuated by the pure principles of benevolence, arrived in this town
some time in October last, and for the purpose of investing their surplus funds in such
a manner, as best to promote the interests of
the Redeemer's Kingdom and produce the
greatest amount of good. On their arrival,
few individuals of this city, convened at
their request, to whom they disclosed the
plan of a school and submitted it to their
judgment and discretion. Here it is worthy

Here it is worthy of remark, that some of the individuals who attended on this occasion, had been deeply impressed with the importance of this tubject, and auxiously solicitous that someting should be done in this section of the country for the cause of Zion. It may well be supposed then, that no time was lost, in embracing the proposed plan, which was so admirably adapted to our wants, and the more so when they had the additional encouragement, of a permanent support from its projectors. The conditions of this surgement, were predicated upon the following, which is the plan of the institution.

That the institution be located in the vicinity of Cincinnat. That as a fundamental principle, each student shall be required to spend a certain portion of time in manual labor, in farming or the mechanics, which then is prescribed by the Board at not less that it consists of a Preparatory, s. Liberry and a Theological department, and these departments to be settled wishinct. That the fire for the Preparatory course is indefinite, for the Literary four years, and for the Theological three years, and each department to lave its appropriate Professors and Teachers. The course of studies in each of these departments will vary only from other colleges, in the expulsion of such branches as are less useful, and the introduction of others of greater utility. The support of the institution will depend principally, upon the sanguine, that from experiments already tried in several places, that the amount of the proceeds from labor bestowed, will more than balance the whole expense of the institution.
