

An Act to incorporate the "Slave Seminary"

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, that there shall be established

in the vicinity of Cincinnati a Seminary of learning the primary object of which shall be to educate young men for the gospel ministry under the style & title of the "Slave Seminary" —

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, that the fundamental principle of this Seminary shall be that every student be required to spend not less than three nor more than five hours each day on an average in agricultural or mechanical labor the avails of which shall be applied towards defraying the expenses of the institution including the board &c of the students —

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, that Joshua S. Wilcox, David Root, James Challen, William Schellenger, Robert Deal Jr., Abby C. Lewis, John F. Keys, Isaac J. Durrell, Ephraim Robbins, James Warren, John H. Grouseck, Robert Wallace, William W. Greene, John Thompson, Daniel Hayden, Benjamin Gray, Samuel G. Gandy, Jacob Sandidy, Caleb Kemper, Amos Thompson, Daniel Wurtz, Samuel Fairbank & Abielan A. Stacey and their associates & successors known by the name of the "Ohio Board of Education" be & they hereby are created to make a body corporate & politic with perpetual succession who shall be known & distinguished by the name & style of the "Trustees of the Slave Seminary" & by that name & style they & their associates & successors shall be a body a law capable of contracting & being contracted with, suing & being sued, pleading & being impleaded, answering &

being annexed unto, defending & being defended & natural
juries are or may be in all courts & places, & in all
manner of suits, Complaints, bills, causes, & matters what-
ever - They may have & use a common seal - They shall
be capable of purchasing, receiving, holding, & Enjoying,
and of granting, selling, & Conveying any estate or property
real or personal necessary for promoting the object of this
act of incorporation which object is above declared -

Sec. 4. And be it further enacted, That the Trustees aforesaid
& their associates hereafter shall have power to supplement
the Board by filling the vacancies occasioned by
death, resignation, unreasonable absence or otherwise provided
that the said Board shall always consist of not less
than twenty three nor more than thirty five Trustees -

Sec. 5. And be it further enacted, That there shall annually
be elected by the said Board of Trustees from their own
body a President, then Vice President, a Recording Secretary
a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer & such other Officers
as the said Trustees the Associates & Successors may
find it necessary from time to time to appoint -

Sec. 6. And be it further enacted, That the Board shall
annually elect an Executive Committee consisting of thirteen
Trustees, including the Officers, who shall conduct the
affairs of the Board under its direction, Seven of whom
shall constitute a quorum -

Sec. 7. And be it further enacted, That the Officers & members
of the Executive Committee shall reside in the city of
Cincinnati or its vicinity and shall be elected by ballot -

Sec. 8. And be it further enacted, That a majority of the
Members of the Board of the Executive Committee as well
as all the instructors employed in the Theological department
of the Seminary, shall be members of the Presbyterian Church
under the Care of the General Assembly of the United
States in good standing. —

Sec. 9. And be it further enacted, That the first officers of the
Board shall be Rev. John S. Wilson President, Rev. David
Root, Rev. Jacob Lindley & Isaac G. Donisthorpe Vice Presidents —
Abraham A. Dally Recording Secretary, James Warren Corresponding
Secretary & John H. Grosbeck Treasurer who together with
John F. Keys, Abby C. Lewis, William H. Green, Robert Boal Jr.
Calvert Kimper, & William Schillinger shall compose the first
Executive Committee to serve in their respective offices until
the annual meeting in the year 1829 —

Sec. 10. And be it further enacted, That the Board of Trustees
of Said Seminary may grant & confer on any candidate
in such form as they may direct all or any of the
degrees that are usually conferred in any College or
University within the United States —

Sec. 11. And be it further enacted, That the Board of
Trustees may appoint such Professors & Tutors as they shall
think necessary & remove them at their pleasure — They may
from time to time make & enforce such rules, regulations and
by-laws for the government & well being of the Seminary
as may seem to them proper — Provided they be consistent
with the laws of the United States & of this State — They
may vest in the faculty or professors such powers as
they may think expedient for the promotion
of good order & for enforcing obedience

to the rules & regulations to be laid of - the
institution - by my hold their meetings at such
times & places as they may designate & appoint - The
President may call special meetings at any time &
such meetings shall always be called by the President or
Recording Secretary at the written request of two of the
members of the Board of which meetings notice shall
be given - And generally the Board shall have power to
perform all such matters & things as they may judge
expay for the benefit of said institution -

Sec. 12. And be it further enacted, That the annual meeting
of the Board of Trustees shall be held on the last
Wednesday in October at 10 o'clock A.M. when the
Officers & Executive Committee shall be chosen, the
proceedings of the past year reported, the accounts
audited & such other business transacted as may occur -

This Act shall be subject to such
alterations as the General Assembly may from time
to time see fit to make -
